Jane Imrie is Deputy Director of the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCETM) in England, a government-funded organisation which aims to ensure that all teachers of mathematics, in all phases, have access to high quality, evidence-based, subject-specific professional development throughout their careers. The NCETM also manages the Maths Hubs programme in England.

Immediately before joining the Centre in 2006, she was a National Subject Lead for Mathematics in the Department for Education and Skills (now DfE) Standards Unit, managing the development of the post-16 mathematics teaching and learning framework 'Improving learning in mathematics' and serving on the department's Mathematics Board.

Jane has worked in mathematics education throughout her career, having taught and managed mathematics in secondary schools and further education for over 20 years. Subsequently, she led, contributed to, or advised on, a number of national projects, mainly focused on professional development for teachers of mathematics, including PRIMAS. She has been an active member of subject associations throughout her career and was President of the Mathematical Association for 2009-2010.
